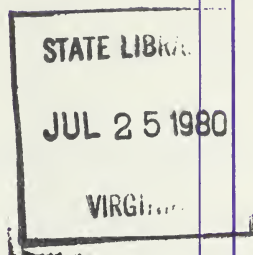

RECAPITULATION

The following Amendment to the Constitution of Virginia received a favorable majority of the votes cast and became part of the Constitution on January 1, 1979:

Section 6 of Article X FOR 690,479
AGAINST 324,236

Chapter 600 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1978 authorizing pari-mutuel betting on horse racing in the Commonwealth and providing for its regulation failed to receive a majority of the votes cast. This referendum was defeated:
