OFFICIAL STATEMENT OF THE WHOLE NUMBER OF VOTES CAST IN THE COMMONWEALTH OF VIRGINIA FOR AND AGAINST A CERTAIN PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF VIRGINIA AT THE GENERAL ELECTION HELD ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 5, 1974.

QUESTION: Shall Section 11 of Article VIII of the Constitution of Virginia be amended so as to allow grants to or on behalf of students attending non-profit institutions of higher education and to empower the General Assembly to permit the State or any political subdivision thereof to contract with non-profit institutions of higher education for the provision of educational or other related services?
